REGISTER OF CONSULTANTS

Membership of a Professional Historians Association in Australia requires accreditation under a *National Standard* endorsed by the Professional Historians Australia (PHA). There are four membership categories. Two are for people who practise as professional historians, one is for graduate historians, and the other, which is not available in all states and territories, is for historical researchers.

The admission criteria for the first three categories are in the PHA *National Standard for the Accreditation of Professional Historians in Australia*. Those for the fourth category are in the PHA *National Standard for the Accreditation of Historical Researchers in Australia*. A *Checklist for the PHA Accreditation Categories* presents the acceptable combinations of academic qualifications and professional experience in a convenient tabular format. Each document mentioned above is available via the PHA Website.

Fees charged by members differ according to their qualifications, expertise and the length of the project being undertaken as indicated in the <u>Scale of Fees recommended for the engagement of Accredited Professional Historians in Australia</u>. The availability of all members is likely to be subject to work in progress.

Whilst each PHA (WA) member must adhere to the PHA <u>Code of Ethics and Professional Standards for Professional Historians in Australia</u>, the Association cannot guarantee that a member will be suitable for a specific project or task. The Association publishes this list in good faith, and with due care, but it reminds those who use it that the PHA (WA) members named below are independent professionals and should be treated as such.
